

Microsoft PowerPoint



This app drives Microsoft PowerPoint. It allows saving a PowerPoint file to the following formats: PDF, PDF/A, XPS, PPT and PPTX.



Note: The Microsoft PowerPoint app only runs on Windows.

Application discovery details



This app automatically detects the PowerPoint application from the registry.

Connections

This app expects at least one incoming connection and one outgoing connection.

Properties

Property	Description
Element type	The flow element type: Microsoft PowerPoint. This property is useful to identify renamed flow elements. It cannot be changed.
Name	The name of the flow element displayed in the canvas.
Description	A description of the flow element displayed in the canvas. This description is also shown in the tooltip that appears when moving your cursor over the flow element.
Save as	The method or format to save the job: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PDF

Property	Description
	 <p>Note: When saving as PDF the page size and orientation are taken from the page setup of the document.</p> <hr/> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PDF/A • XPS • ppt • pptx <p>The last two formats are interesting if it is necessary to save the file in an older (ppt) or newer version (pptx) of the PowerPoint format.</p>
<i>Output type</i>	<p>When saving the file as PDF, PDF/A or XPS, this extra property determines in what form the file will be saved. This can be as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Slides: One slide fills a page • Notes: A view of the slide at the top and the notes underneath • Outline: A running text of the slides without the graphics • Handouts: More than one slide on a page; in the case of three page handouts there is room for taking notes
Images in document	<p>Insert and embeds all images:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Insert: Embeds all images. • Keep as is: Does nothing. <hr/>  <p>Note: Inserting images requires that the link to the original image is available.</p> <hr/>
Fail jobs with unavailable fonts	<p>If set to Yes, the app fails any jobs that use one or more fonts that can't be found or activated; these jobs are either moved along the error out connection or moved to the Problem jobs folder.</p> <p>If set to No, the app doesn't test for unavailable fonts.</p>
